East Drayton village survey

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Executive summary

Overall results: character of the village

- East Drayton residents would like the village to retain its current friendly, rural and agricultural nature
- They would also like to the village to have more opportunities, and to be a place where people can thrive
- There is a sense of the sort of culture ED would like to be warm, welcoming, inclusive and nurturing.
 Villagers currently regard ED as welcoming, but score it lower on the attributes of nurturing, inclusivity,
 thriving and openness
- The village would like to see more social clubs and community opportunities, such as sports facilities
- The villagers expressed a need for better infrastructure, connectivity and tech links
- From an environmental perspective, the villagers want ED to be a sustainable and green place
- Results were quite consistent across groups such as gender and occupation. However younger, and newer residents, are groups which may be underrepresented in the sample*
- Quotes in the report have been taken from the open questions in the survey. Quotes have not been included if they were not relevant to the survey questions or topics. Quotes that contained specific references to people or properties in the village, have been edited to depersonalise but maintain their policy perspective


Overall results: housing

- 36 of the responses indicated that they wanted the village to plan for only the stipulated minimum amount
 of housing development
- 50 responses favoured the approach being based on the village-specific criteria of planned sites (25) or infilling (25)
- The villagers expressed a desire for a mixed approach to housing, with different sizes. There was a divided opinion whether this should be 1-2 or 3-4 bedrooms
- Villagers also clearly stated their preference for the development of affordable housing, regardless of whether this was a house or bungalow
- The majority favoured the retaining the traditional style of architecture, but a significant minority were open to a mix of styles
- The results were consistent across age, occupation and gender. Some differences emerged between shorter and longer term residents, with the longer term group more open to housing development

Survey respondents


Age and gender

- Majority of responses are from the 46 – 60+ age bracket
- Even split between male and female




Employment status and age

- Majority of respondents are retired 60+
- Followed by those 46-60 working



Time in village and age

- Majority of respondents are long term residents who have been in the village 20+ years
- The sample contains fewer residents who have been in the village less than 5 years,
 which may be a true reflection of the village's profile, rather than just those who responded to the survey




Survey results

ED as a place

Which words do you associate with ED today?

- Rural, agricultural and farming were the top three responses
- Quiet and small were also prominent results
- Fun, opportunities, ambitious and exciting were the bottom results
- Welcoming did well, but nurturing and inclusive had low scores
- Great infrastructure and technology also scored lowly
- Quirky, different and inclusive were also low




Which words do you associate with ED today? quotes




- The highest score is again rural (58), with agricultural (54) and farming (44) closely related
- Second highest score is friendly (57), with welcoming (49) and sociable (45) in the same theme
- Nurturing and inclusive also increased, amplifying the desire a warm culture
- The village wants to be a place for pet lovers
- Great for adults and great for children score almost identically, indicating a desire to welcome all ages



- The biggest percentage increases are thriving (31%), and opportunities (25%). In contrast, one of the biggest falls is quiet (-14%)
- This is followed by Great for Children (24%)
- Sustainable is at (18%)
- Infrastructure (24%), great tech (18%) and great connectivity (16%)
- Inclusive (17%), warm (15%) and nurturing (14%) also increase



- The lowest results are for exciting, quirky - which contrast with the high score for quiet
- Sherwood and East Midlands scored poorly. Nottinghamshire and Notts/Lincs border were identified with more
- Garden villages and wider local community were in the middle
- As a group, the geographic identity options were less popular than ones describing the village environment (e.g rural) or its nature (e.g welcoming)




What would you like to see more of in ED in the future?


- Top result Green and sustainable environment

More in the village: time of residence


- Most desires track across both shorter and longer term residents
- Longer term residents are more in favour of housing development






More in the village: time of residence

Small housing to bring young to village






Approach to housing planning


- 36 responses agreed with the statement that the approach to planning should be to meet the minimum requirement
- 50 responses favoured planning around a village-specific approach
- 25 stated the desire to plan for specific sites
- 25 believed that the approach should be to infill where possible
- 4 were open to discussion, with 1 don't know



Approach by age bracket: an even distribution








- Those who have been in the village less time (under 10 years) are skewed towards the minimum requirement approach
- Residents with 10+ years in the village are more evenly split

Limit to 1-2 individual build to provide organic development + avoid estate style



Size of housing

- 44 responses believe that the village should focus on a mix of different sized properties
- The majority of the remaining respondents were split between 1-2 and 3-4 bedrooms
- Only a small minority are in favour of a focus on houses with 5 or more bedrooms



No more new builds - this is a small farming village lets keep as it is for the next generation


Type of housing


- In common with size, a mix of was the top choice for housing types

 Desire for a focus on more houses was strongest with the 31-60 age bracket







- The majority of responses (51) wanted to retain ED's current focus on traditional architecture
- But a significant minority (24 responses) are in favour of a mix of styles
- A focus purely on contemporary styles was only favoured by one person!
