The government has now extended the free Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) scheme for health and social care providers to 31 March 2024 or until the Department of Health and Social Care's stocks are depleted, <u>whichever is sooner</u>. There have been no changes to ordering or guidance on the use of PPE.



DHSC will publish further information about stock-out dates by PPE category (when it is expected to run out of specific types of PPE) by April 2023.

This is all part of the Government's Help for Households scheme to tackle the cost of living.




