ST PETER'S CHURCH, ROOF REPAIR - LATEST NEWS FROM OUR PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL

"During the summer months Stage 1 of the English Heritage grant of £18k has been used to determine the scope of work required to rectify the damage caused by death watch beetle and to repair the drainage system. The reports and plans to preserve the original timber where possible and to improve the ventilation and drainage will be presented to English Heritage in November. If they are satisfied, then Stage 2 of the grant, £146k, will be awarded in February 2013.

The PCC are also applying for further grants, <u>as we must raise a further £38k to complete the work.</u> East Drayton Parish Council has already pledged £1500 and their chair, Neil Stanley has made an urgent appeal for funds to restore the roof and to help minimise the risk of closure that faces so many rural churches:

"PLEASE can you help in any way – by direct contribution, by fund raising or in any other way"

To get the appeal off to a flying start, **NOA NOA of Lincoln** held a fashion show in St Peter's last Thursday. An enthusiastic audience packed the church and lovely models, Pimms and canapés made for a great evening. The magnificent sum of **£815** was raised for the roof appeal.
